Azerbaijani investigative journalist Khadija Ismayilova Released from Prison

Azerbaijani investigative journalist Khadija Ismayilova was released last week on probation, days before her 40th birthday. Ismayilova had been sentenced to seven and a half years in prison on trumped-up financial charges in September 2015, having been detained since December 2014. The remainder of her sentence has been commuted to a three-year conditional sentence. She will be subject to a travel ban and other restrictions. PEN will continue to campaign for all restrictions against her to be lifted...[read more](#)

Ismayilova's case was one of the **cases that we highlighted** last year during the **Day of**

the **Imprisoned Writer** event we held in Cape Town.

“I wasn’t convinced that the government was prepared to show goodwill toward political prisoners and prisoners of conscience,” Ismayilova said after her release.

“But evidently, the pressure put on the authorities to release me was very effective, and the government realised in the end that holding me in prison was more costly than letting me go, and therefore they simply released me.”

This highlights the importance of the ongoing work that PEN has been doing to secure her release.

“My birthday wish is: keep doing whatever you can to get someone out of prison, because it is important,” she said. “It worked with me. It can work with others.”...**read more**

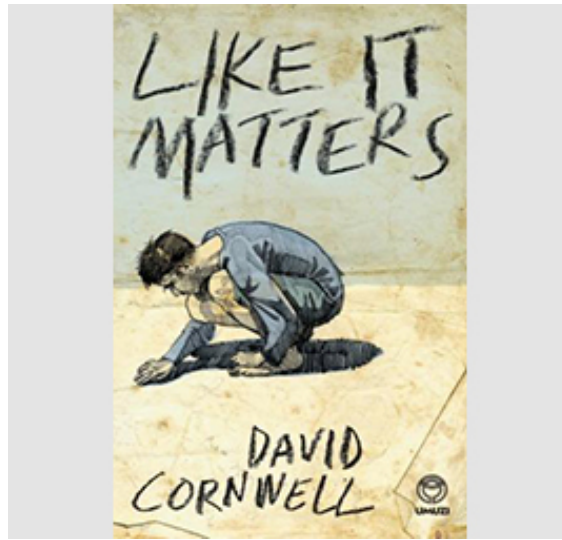

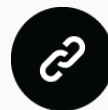
