PEN South Africa AGM Report

The electronic AGM document was emailed to all members on the 31st May 2017. Members were asked to respond approving (or not) the contents of the AGM document, the financials, and proposed changes to our constitution by 5.00 p.m. on the 30th June 2017. Comments were also invited.

As per our current constitution 25% of members in good standing were required to form a quorum. 165 members out of 310 were in good standing and 79 attendance responses/votes were received, thus 47.88% and so a quorum was formed. Six comments were received.

In order to change the constitution 66.6% of members in good standing were required to approve the suggested changes. One objection to one of the proposed clause amendments was received. Only 47.88% of members voted and so the required percentage was not achieved and thus the changes cannot be implemented at this time. The proposed changes concerned officially changing the name of SA PEN to PEN SA, officially providing for different types of membership (Professional, Supporter, Honorary and Publisher), and providing for how electronic AGMs should operate.

Nadia Davids, Nooshin Erfani-Ghadimi, Yewande Omotoso and Karina Szczurek, were proposed as members of the committee at this 2017 AGM. Their CVs were provided in the AGM document. No objections being received, these four candidates were duly elected on to the executive committee.

Margie Orford indicated at this AGM that she would be stepping down as President at the subsequent executive committee meeting but was happy to remain as an ordinary member of the committee. Nadia Davids was duly, as per the constitutional requirements, elected by the executive committee at a meeting held 15th June 2017, as our new President. Thus subsequent to this AGM the PEN SA executive committee consists of:


