The decision by the University of Cape Town to rescind the invitation to the Danish journalist and editor, Flemming Rose, to deliver the annual TB Davie lecture on Academic Freedom provoked a great deal of heated discussion. This lacuna in this prestigious lecture's fifty year history demands of us that we consider these questions seriously and with care. The **responses** do just that in nuanced and carefully considered positions that are reflective of the debate on campuses across the United States, in England and in South Africa.

This debate is still open - the issues raised go beyond the cancellation of one lecture

by one controversial speaker – and I would like to keep it open. The larger questions raised need to be aired and debated in the same spirit of generosity and understanding that was evident in this discussion. We hope to publish some more essays on this subject in the next month.

PEN South Africa will be collaborating with other organisations and institutions to host a seminar series around the nature of and the limits to free expression. We will use this debate to broaden the scope of this public conversation that is so crucial if South Africa's universities – and our broader society – is to successfully navigate this complex and often incendiary terrain.

We are continuing to take submissions on this subject.
