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PEN SA Submission on the Hate Crimes and Hate Speech Bill

The South African Department of Justice and Constitutional Development published the draft **Prevention and Combating of Hate Crimes and Hate Speech Bill** in October 2016. PEN South Africa, under the guidance of Vice-President Raymond Louw and with carefully debated contributions from members of the PEN South Africa Board, has been hard at work formulating a considered and nuanced response to this proposed legislation. As you will see in the submission, we are cognisant of and concerned with the social problems that this Bill seeks to address,

however, we are not convinced that the deep divisions in our society will be redressed by this legislation. We are deeply concerned by the implications for free speech and artistic expression.

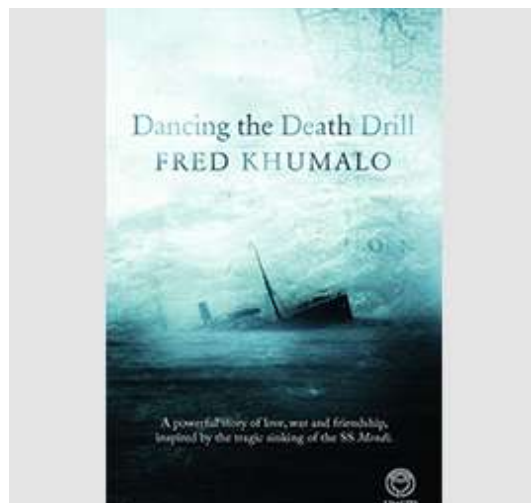
