It has been a profound pleasure and a privilege to reflect on Margie Orford's tenure

as President of PEN South Africa. As I sifted through the various reports and documents that detailed her years of commitment, I was struck, continually, not only by the sheer range of work she presided over, but by the depth of investment and care she showed each project. Margie came to PEN SA in 2010 when the Secrecy Bill was being tabled; it is impossible to overstate how important the fight against that bill was, or how corrosive its implementation would have been to our democracy. Under Margie's leadership, PEN SA mobilised against the bill, both engaging parliamentarians and alerting the public to the grave and long-lasting impact it could have on a free and fair press. Her focus on the Hate Speech and Hate Crimes Bill has been similarly clear-eyed, politically alert and strategic....read more


