"Young People Want to Write, They Want to Have Their Say": An interview with Robin Malan on a half-century at English Alive

Perhaps more than any other magazine in South African literature – or, at the very least, as much as the likes of *Staffrider*, or *Contrast*, or *Classic – English Alive* has catalysed writing careers, and inspired people to familiarise themselves with the craft of writing. Publishing writing in English by high school students throughout South Africa for more than the past half-century, *English Alive* has provided many past,

current, and future giants of South African literature their first publications, and showed thousands of young adults that their expression is valuable.

Among the many people who have edited the annual – including new editor Twanji Kalula, and past editors Michael King and Kathleen Heugh – undoubtedly its greatest servant is Robin Malan, anthologist, playwright, novelist, humourist, sex educator, publisher and editor. Last week, at the launch of *English Alive* 51, Robin was awarded with a 50+ years Dedicated Service Award by his colleagues, named the Order of Imbewu. An apt name – for Malan has grown many seeds.


Margie Orford Interviewed about Oleg Sentsov on France 24

To mark the hundredth day of imprisoned filmmaker Oleg Sentsov's indefinite hunger strike in a Siberian penal colony, PEN SA and PEN International Board Member Margie Orford spoke to France 24's *The Debate*, in a bid to raise awareness about his plight.

Following Russia's annexation of Crimea, Ukrainian-born Sentsov was arrested in Crimea and convicted to 20 years in jail by a Russian court on charges of plotting terrorism acts. Although these allegations appear to be fabricated, Sentsov is still kept in prison by Russian authorities, without access to any correspondence.

On 22 August, our colleagues at PEN International and English PEN – in partnership with Save Oleg Sentsov, Amnesty UK, and the Belarus Free Theatre – **delivered messages of support from all over the world to the Russian Embassy in London**, urging the authorities to ensure that Sentsov is allowed to receive them. After the Russian Embassy refused to accept the messages, a reading of Sentsov's work took place.






