Zehra Doğan released after over 500 days in prison

Kurdish artist and journalist, Zehra Doğan has been released from Tarsus prison in Mersin, Turkey, after serving over five hundred days behind bars. Ms Doğan was sentenced to two years, nine months and 22 days in prison on a charge of 'propagandising for a terrorist organisation' for her work as a painter and journalist. In 2017, PEN SA shone a spotlight on Ms Doğan's case as part of our **Day of the Imprisoned Writer**.

PEN International reiterates its call to the Turkish authorities to end their crackdown on freedom of expression and release all those imprisoned for their peaceful exercise of this fundamental right.




Meet PEN SA's new interns, Daniela Friedman and Tasneem Allybokus
